HOW MUCH DOES PrEP COST?

- Depending on where you live and other factors, from \$60 per month for a generic to \$2,000 per month for brand names.
- Lab tests and doctor visits can reach \$15,000 a year.



IF YOU HAVE EMPLOYER-PROVIDED OR ACA MARKETPLACE INSURANCE:

- •In most cases, PrEP should be free with one of these.
- Most insurance plans cover copays, coinsurance, or deductibles
 related to your medication or other services (such as some visits,
 HIV and STI screenings, labs, pregnancy tests, or drug adherence
 counseling).
- •If your insurance still charges a copay, coinsurance, or deductible, prep4all.org has a form to file an insurance noncompliance.

IF YOU HAVE MEDICARE OR MEDICAID:

- PrEP should be covered.
- You can also apply for other programs to get it for free or at a lower cost.

IF YOU DON'T HAVE INSURANCE OR HAVE LIMITED COVERAGE:

 You can still get PrEP for free or at a lower cost through other programs.
